## CORK JEWELLER SHINES AT AWARDS CEREMONY

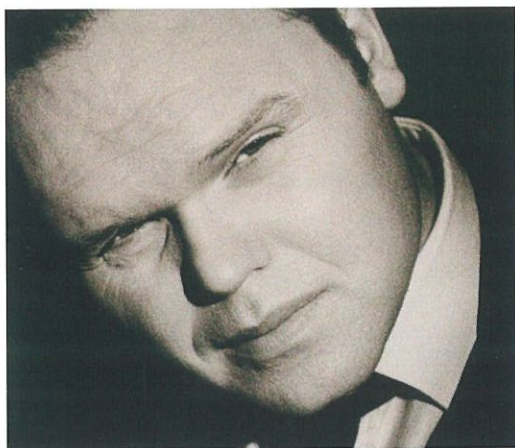
